Theme 1: History of Philosophy / World Philosophies

(Updated: November 20, 2023)

Description:	We will be attempting a whirlwind tour across the history of world philosophies, from ancient Greece, India and China to the present day. Obviously, we won't be able to cover this field comprehensively, but we hope to encounter many of the highlights. This survey will also give us exposure to a wide range of key philosophical questions, and approaches that have arisen to examine them. We are likely to list several readings for each meeting, but will probably focus discussion on a smaller number, determined in advance.
	With some helpful guidance and research from advisors and participants, we also hope to reference readings to provide more diversity in terms of geography, cultural traditions and gender than is typically included in surveys of Western philosophy. So, our reading lists might change now and then as we work our way through the schedule.
